At MYAN NSW we engage, support and connect multicultural young people settling into Australia. We resource young people with new skills and broader networks of influence. We collaborate with young people across the state so that your needs are met and your voices are heard.

PEER2PEER YOUTH LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

MYAN NSW trained young people with lived experience of resettlement to deliver a peer-to-peer settlement initiative to newly arrived young people in NSW schools.

This was delivered on 22 March 2024 to 10 young people in Granville, NSW. Young peer facilitators are remunerated for their time and offered a skills reference to increase their employability.



NEW BEGINNINGS SCHOOLS ENGAGEMENT PROGRAM

MYAN NSW delivered peer-led workshops to newly arrived students in NSW high schools to assist with their settlement in Australia.

The MYAN NSW youth engagement team and 8 Peer facilitators delivered the New Beginnings program in April 2024 to 60 humanitarian arrival school students in Bankstown, NSW.

This program is set to grow in 2024-2027 and will be delivered in Liverpool, Fairfield and Armidale as well as in Bankstown.



SCHOOLS ENGAGEMENT NSW

MYAN NSW attended the Bankstown Senior College Wellness Expo in August 2023 and June 2024. The event connects school students with community and government agencies that provide mental and general health, legal, welfare, cultural and social support.

A MYAN NSW Peer Facilitator hosted the MYAN NSW stall alongside the Youth Engagement Team and shared his experience of being a Peer Facilitator at MYAN NSW with the expo attendees.

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SKILLS WORKSHOPS

MYAN NSW delivered a skills-building and information program titled 'Youth Advisor Hub.' Six weeks of workshops equipped newly arrived young people with skills and training in public speaking, social policy and leadership skills to represent youth affairs to decision makers.

This was delivered over the course of 6 workshops from 19 July 2023 to 27 November 2023 to 10 young people in Granville, NSW at The Granville Centre.

The Youth Advisor Hub co-delivered a policy brief titled 'Addressing the Rental Crisis on Young People Living in NSW'.

The Youth Advisor Hub launched this policy paper alongside MYAN NSW at the MYAN NSW Annual Youth Forum hosted online in November 2023 to 23 young people and service providers from Department of Home Affairs, TAFE NSW, NSW Police, Multicultural NSW, NSW Health, and Department of Communities and Justice.

COFFEE CONNECT: BUILDING YOUNG PEOPLE'S SOCIAL NETWORKS

MYAN NSW delivered an informal peer networking event for young people to connect and socialise over a free beverage.

MYAN NSW delivered this program in January and June 2024 to 25 young people in Parramatta, NSW at San Churros Cafe in Parramatta.





SUMMER WRAP

MYAN NSW delivered a peer- network building event that provided a safe space for young people to network, socialise and engage with other young people, the MYAN NSW team and other relevant sector stakeholders. The event consisted of social activities that included the participation of young people, MYAN NSW staff and key stakeholders.

This was delivered on 8 December 2023 to 20 young people at the PHIVE Parramatta NSW.

YOUTH RETREAT

MYAN NSW delivered a youth retreat event in June 2024 to 37 students at Bankstown Senior College in Bankstown, NSW.






Supporting Individual Young People

MYAN NSW has supported 46 young individuals in the year 2023-24 to achieve Active Citizenship Indicators as per the National Youth Settlement Framework by facilitating their access to employment, education and social services.

NSW COMPACT ALLIANCE: KAIROS

MYAN NSW celebrates, supports and affirms young people identifying from cultural and LGBTIQA+ communities. In 2022 MYAN NSW launched KAIROS - an 18-month program co-designed by young people aiming to address and support young women and gendered diverse young people from cultural communities. KAIROS explores how to establish connections with local queer groups, and rediscover long standing community practices used to bring people together in times of crisis and joy and creating a resilient and cohesive society. MYAN NSW has engaged 35 young women and non binary people from cultural communities and those who identify as queer.

MYAN NSW X ABC

MYAN NSW created a partnership with ABC News. Young people have told us they want to better understand how stories are made, framed and shape our understanding of our own communities.

We held workshops with women working as journalists at the ABC and those from cultural communities on how the media works.

The Kairos program is proudly supported by Multicultural NSW and the NSW COMPACT Alliance.


MYAN NSW X YOUTH LED SERVICES

MYAN NSW hosts intercultural conversations in partnership with First Nations colleagues at Youth Led Services.

Young people at MYAN NSW are keen for opportunities to grow relationships with Aboriginal and Torres Straight Islander people.

One participant expressed "I learned that my culture has a lot in common with Aboriginal culture and we made a connection with each other by sharing our stories".

SOCIAL MEDIA FOOTPRINT

In 2023 - 2024, MYAN NSW delivered 67 Instagram posts and 24 LinkedIn posts engaging young people and the sector.

MYAN NSW released two major campaigns on social media in 2024.

The Hello@ campaign strategically engaged youth from the five (5) top resettlement language communities in NSW.

METRICS DEMONSTRATED STRONG AUDIENCE INTERACTION, WITH OUR SOCIAL MEDIA ANALYTICS SHOWING A 54% INCREASE IN IMPRESSIONS, A 75% INCREASE IN ENGAGEMENT RATE AND 28.7% INCREASE IN ACCOUNTS REACHED FOLLOWING THE LAUNCH OF THIS CAMPAIGN.



STRENGTHEN THE YOUTH AND SETTLEMENT SECTOR

THE MYAN NSW NETWORK HIGHLIGHT

MYAN NSW receives over 100+ requests a year to provide research, training and other specialist expertise to the youth services and humanitarian settlement sector in youth specific approaches.

We lead a network of approximately 1400 services across NSW. Our industry leadership is supported by our trauma-informed, youth best-practice policy lens approach.

We have continued to lead the Youth and Settlement Social Services Industries and have produced the following events:

In Times of Crisis and Joy: Network meeting 2023

MYAN NSW collaborated with NSW Police's Counter Terrorism and Special Tactics Command Engagement and Hate Crime Unit to deliver a training session in June 2023 at the PHIVE in Parramatta, NSW.


Topics covered included what is a hate crime, how to report it and how to seek support when you have been a victim of or witness a hate crime or a hate incident. 60 people attended this free event, including 35 students.



In November 2023 Youth Advisor Hub members delivered a youth forum and presented on the policy brief created in the Youth Advisor Hub program that addresses the impact of the rental crisis on young people living in NSW







THE MYAN NSW NETWORK HIGHLIGHT

International Women's Day Youth Forum 2024 In March 2024 MYAN NSW delivered a youth-led forum at ABC News head office in Ultimo, NSW.

5 young people participated in facilitated panel discussion, sharing their experience and learnings from the MYAN NSW COMPACT program: KAIROS

This forum was delivered to young people, Multicultural NSW, school representatives, and The ABC News.



NYSF Training 2024

MYAN NSW in partnership with the Andrew Cummings Training and Consultancy facilitated a training session on 24 April and 8 May 2024 on the National Youth Settlement Framework in Parramatta, NSW.

Topics covered included how practitioners and key decision makers can implement the NYSF into their practice by using the NYSF Assessment Tools, the factors that contribute to good settlement outcomes for young people and how to facilitate active participation.

19 Practitioners and students attend this training.

NYSF Train the Trainer 2024

MYAN NSW in partnership with the Andrew Cummings Training and Consultancy facilitated a NYSF Train the Trainer in Parramatta, NSW.

This training was delivered to the MYAN NSW team and colleague Rucy Rusera, Youth Community Educator at SSI Queensland.



ADVOCACY AND POLICY HIGHLIGHTS

The work we do supporting young people to settle well, helps us shape narrative and influence policy making in the Australian landscape.

Our advocacy and political representations to elected ministers, parliamentarians, the legislature and the media have included:

- 1. Representation to the NSW Department Parliamentary Secretary to the Deputy Premier (July 2023)
- 2. Representation on Legislative Ban on LGBTQ+ Conversion Practices Education and Youth run by NSW Health- Stakeholder Roundtable (Aug 2023)
- 3. Homes NSW Youth Consultation (Sept 2023)
- 4. Multicultural Framework Review Consultation (Aug 2023)
- 5. Submission on Section 93Z of the Crimes Act 1900 (NSW) in addressing serious racial and religious vilification in NSW submission (April 2024)
- 6. Minister Giles' 2024-25 Humanitarian Program community consultation (May 2024)

It was a year of big wins for MYAN NSW.

In 2023, MYAN NSW won the award for Youth Service of the Year in NSW at the NSW Youth Worth Awards produced by Youth Action - the peak body for youth affairs in NSW.

We were also granted \$1.3 million in SETS funding from DHA, securing expectations of our service delivery to 2027.

MYAN NSW successfully launched our five year Strategic Plan (2023- 2028) and theory of change. We applied to the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC) to become a Publicly Benevolent Institution (PBI) and are awaiting a decision.

Our regional engagement is now officially in three settlement areas of Western Sydney - Fairfield, Liverpool and Bankstown and in Armidale, a regional settlement community in the New England region of NSW.

Access to specialist cultural support and clinical supervision continues to be provided to staff. MYAN NSW is an organisation that respects that team members possess lived experience and are at risk of vicarious trauma or being re-traumatised while supporting young people in highly vulnerable situations. Cultural support and clinical supervision is crucial to all MYAN NSW projects and has been added as a mitigation strategy in our risk assessments. The need for staff with lived experience to access culturally appropriate support is not currently covered by the parameters of existing programs such as the Employee Assistance program (EAP) which has now ceased to be extended to NGOs by the NSW Government.

Managing an entirely remote office continues to be a source of inspiration and challenge requiring courage, but has enabled our team to be more visible in community centres, schools, local libraries, local councils and spaces where young people thrive. Our partnerships continue to grow.

Please join me in congratulating the MYAN NSW team and Board for their tireless efforts in delivering this critical work.




